My Place Photography Competition 2021

My Place Photography Competition is very much about the process of taking part, about getting out into the civic spaces of Scotland, and exploring built heritage.

A judging panel will select two winning entries, one from a primary school aged entrant and one from a secondary school aged entrant. The judges will also select a few commended and highly commended images.

A Young Person's judging panel will select a winner of the Young Person's Choice Award.

The winners are invited to attend a prize-giving ceremony. The venue and date for the ceremony will be announced at a later date. Winners will also receive two printed canvases of their photograph - one for the school and one for themselves, thanks to Jessops.

All photographs entered to the competition appear in our online picture gallery. You can see the gallery for the 2020 My Place Photography Competition here. All entries are also featured in a physical exhibition held at a venue. Venue details will be announced at a later date. Make sure to sign up to our My Place Photography e-bulletin to keep up-to-date on competition developments.

The Rules: overview

- One entry per child
- Only primary and secondary-school aged children can enter (4-18)
- Photos must be submitted as a digital file (no paper copies are needed) please see Rules of Entry document
- Photos must be the original work of the child if the image has been digitally manipulated, cropped etc. that process must also have been done by the photographer, and not the teacher / group leader.
- Photographs should show some element of Scottish buildings (of any age), archaeology or history.
- The theme for 2020 is CLIMATE CHANGE. If you'd like some ideas of what to photograph for this theme, see the My Place Photography information page.
