

Background Information

My Place Photography Competition is a Scotland-wide heritage photographic project for school-aged young people. It encourages young people to look at the built heritage in the places they live, and develop an understanding of the spaces around them through the medium of photography.

All entries into the competition are considered by a panel of judges, who select two winning images, one for the Primary age category, and one for the Secondary age category. The judges also select highly commended and commended entries.

Last Year's Competition

In 2020, over 630 young people from schools and groups across Scotland were inspired to take part in our competition by looking at the world around them and recording their findings with their cameras. Started in the Year of Young People 2018, we now include an additional prize category, Young Person's Choice. The judging panel was made up of young people, including the winners from 2018. All entries were displayed in an online exhibition on our [My Place website](#).
